Who's Your Daddy?

For over 30 years, millions of Americans tuned in to Maury (originally titled The Maury Povich Show) to see if a simple paternity test would announce to the world that a man was the father of a child. With a total of 5,545 episodes over the course of 31 seasons, Maury is the longest-running daytime talk show with a single host in American history. The quest to understand and identify our father resonates deeply in our culture, as evidenced by the long-running success of shows like Maury.

In the Bible, Jesus provides the ultimate example of what a perfect relationship with a father looks like, describing His relationship with God as loving, intimate, and personal. Jesus often speaks of the Father's love, and highlights their deep connection and mutual indwelling. This relationship is characterized by guidance, provision, forgiveness, unity, and trust. Jesus looks to the Father for direction (John 5:19), relies on Him for provision

(Matthew 6:9-13), and demonstrates complete trust in the Father's plan (Matthew 26:39).

John 17:21 NLT says, I pray that they will all be one, just as you and I are one—as you are in me, Father, and I am in you. And may they be in us so that the world will believe you sent me. God desires the same loving, intimate, and personal relationship with us that He has with Jesus. Believers are adopted into God's family (Romans 8:15-

17) and are loved unconditionally (Jeremiah 31:3). God provides wisdom and direction through His Word and the Holy Spirit (James 1:5; John 14:26), and He promises to meet our needs (Philippians 4:19). Through Jesus, we receive forgiveness and reconciliation (1 John 1:9; Ephesians 1:7), and we are called to unity with Him (2 Peter 1:4; John 17:21). Our relationship with God involves trusting His plans and obeying His commands, knowing that He works for our good (Romans 8:28; John 14:15). Ultimately, God as our Father offers identity, purpose, and belonging, fulfilling our deepest longings and guiding us toward eternal life with Him. Who's Your Daddy?


